College, Nerwa for the session 2024-25, highlighting the key achievements, academic progress and various activities conducted during the past one year. It is also a great moment for us that we are organizing the Twenty Third Annual Prize Distribution Function of the College. I being the Principal of this College, extend a warm and cordial welcome to our esteemed Chief Guest, **Sh. Rajneesh Kimta** (General Secretary, Himachal Pradesh Congress Committee), along with the distinguished dignitaries, esteemed guests and all notable invitees gracing this significant event.

#### 1. ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Govt. College Nerwa is situated on the right bank of river Shalvi in Shimla District of Himachal Pradesh. The College came into being on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2002, after being taken over from the privately managed erstwhile SD College. The college got shifted to its new campus, surrounded by lush green pine forests, apple orchards and snow-capped mountains on 29<sup>th</sup> August, 2017. The inauguration of the new campus was graced by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister, Lt. Sh. Virbhadra Singh. The college campus is spread over 40 bigha of land. It currently nurtures over 550 students across various disciplines, focusing on both academic excellence and holistic development.

#### 2. THE ACADEMIC HISTORY OF COLLEGE

Initially only two streams i.e. Humanities and Commerce, were offered at the undergraduate level. Afterwards, on December 8, 2009, the Non-Medical stream was introduced, followed by the Medical stream on May 29, 2010. After relocating to a new campus in August 2017, the college expanded its offerings further by launching Master's programs in English and Political Science during the academic session 2021-22. Subsequently, M.Com. was also introduced from the academic session 2022-23.

Presently, the college offers a diverse range of programs. At the undergraduate level, it offers B.A. in eight subjects (Hindi, Sanskrit, English, History, Political Science, Economics, Physical Education, and Music - Vocal), B. Com. and B. Sc. in Physical & Life Sciences. At the postgraduate level, Master's degrees in English, Political Science, and Commerce are available.

#### 4. INTERNAL RANKING OF THE COLLEGE

In the preceding year, the State Government, in collaboration with the Directorate of Higher Education, conducted the Annual Ranking of Government Colleges in Himachal Pradesh for the academic session 2023-24. This ranking process followed a rigorous and well-structured evaluation framework, ensuring strict adherence to academic, infrastructural, and other key institutional parameters. An external panel of experts conducted a thorough assessment of all colleges across the state.

It is a matter of pride that our college has secured 820 out of 1,100 marks (75%), earning the 31<sup>st</sup> position among a total 141 Govt. Colleges in Himachal Pradesh. Additionally, among the 42 Govt. Colleges with the student strength between 500 and 1,000, we have achieved an impressive 6<sup>th</sup> rank, which is a testament to our commitment to academic excellence and institutional development.

#### 8. INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

A well-developed infrastructural facility ensures that students feel safe, supported, and valued, leading to improved academic performance. It also fosters inclusivity and helps reduce dropout rates. In this regard, the College has made remarkable progress in enhancing its infrastructure and remains committed to continuous improvement. Our goal is to provide students with a well-equipped environment that offers ample exposure to modern facilities, enabling them to excel in their academic and personal growth.

#### (i) COLLEGE LIBRARY

Libraries play a crucial role in education by providing valuable resources, fostering critical thinking, and promoting research. They encourage students to assess the credibility of information, cultivate reading habits, and enhance the teaching-learning process, making it more engaging and effective.

The college library is well-equipped to create a dynamic academic environment. It houses a collection of nearly 3,829 books, along with subscriptions to six journals & magazines and five newspapers. The library comprises three rooms, including a spacious reading hall with a seating capacity of 60 students, providing an ideal space for study and intellectual growth.

#### (ii) ARTS, COMMERCE AND SCIENCE BLOCKS

The college boasts to have a well-structured infrastructure with 81 rooms, including a spacious examination hall with a seating capacity of 180 examinees, one well-equipped conference hall, and 20 classrooms. Additionally, the campus features a girls' common room, a canteen hall, three multipurpose halls, an IT lab, and six laboratories for both theoretical and practical learning. Furthermore, the college has established four smart classrooms, enabling online classes that are conducted reciprocally with neighboring colleges, enhancing collaborative learning opportunities

#### (iii) INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY LAB

Information technology and computers have become indispensable in the modern world, playing a vital role in imparting knowledge and transforming lives. To ensure students have access to essential digital tools, the college has established a well-equipped IT lab with 30 internet-enabled computers. This facility provides a dedicated space for students to complete assignments, enhance their technical skills, and stay aligned with the rapidly evolving, technology-driven world.

#### (iv) CONFERENCE HALL

A conference hall serves as a multifunctional space for academic, administrative, and extracurricular activities, enhancing learning, governance, and student engagement. The college features a well-furnished conference hall with a seating capacity of approximately 60 persons, equipped with advanced audio-visual aids. It serves as a venue for meetings of the Staff Council, CSCA, OSA, and PTA, as well as seminars, workshops, and training

programs. Additionally, it supports presentations, online webinars, and interactive sessions, fostering holistic student development and academic excellence.

#### (v) COLLEGE CANTEEN

The college has a spacious canteen that caters to both students and staff, offering a wide variety of food items and snacks at nominal prices, ensuring affordability without compromising on quality. Beyond providing nutritious meals, it serves as a vibrant social hub, fostering interaction, relaxation, and inclusivity. It creates a welcoming space for group discussions, collaborations, and student engagement. It enhances campus life by promoting health, social connections, and a strong sense of community.

#### (vi) GYMNASIUM & SPORTS FACILITIES

Gymnasiums have become an integral part of physical education in colleges and universities, offering a safe and controlled environment for students to engage in structured exercise programs. Recognizing the importance of fitness in today's fast-paced and stressful world, the college provides a fully equipped gymnasium free of cost to both students and staff, promoting a healthier and more active lifestyle. In addition, the college has a large playground where a dedicated Kabaddi coach provides training to students both in the morning and evening.

IGNOU serves as a national resource center, promoting and maintaining standards of distance education in India. It offers high-quality, innovative, and need-based programs at affordable costs while also advancing the Open University system in the country. To support this mission, the college operates an IGNOU study-cum-examination center, providing educational facilities to more than 200 learners. The center offers various certificate, diploma and degree programs at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

(i) INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a crucial role in enhancing and

maintaining the quality of education in a college. It encourages research, innovation,

infrastructure development, and stakeholder engagement, including

collaborations. Through periodic assessments and feedback mechanisms, it implements

necessary improvements, fostering a culture of excellence, accountability, and continuous

growth in higher education institutions.

a) Student Admission Software Training

On May 25, 2024, IQAC organized a hands-on training session in the Zoology lecture

hall for newly appointed assistant professors. Conducted by IQAC Coordinator Dr.

Vikas Suman and Prof. Sanjeev Justa, the session equipped faculty with skills to

handle admission software, ensuring a smooth UG admission process.

b) Computer Training Programme

From May 20-27, 2024, IQAC conducted one-week training on "Use of MS Office in

Office Automation and Classroom Teaching" for six staff members with limited

computer proficiency. Participants who successfully completed the course received

certificates from the Principal.

c) Lecture Series on POSH

On July 22, 2024, IQAC, in collaboration with the Women Empowerment Cell,

conducted a lecture series on POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) in the college conference hall. The session educated staff on workplace rights, responsibilities, and measures to foster a safe and respectful environment for women.

#### d) Internal Ranking Achievement

On October 22, 2024, the IQAC submitted the 'Self-Assessment Report' to the Director of Higher Education for the College's internal ranking, in accordance with the prescribed framework. Through systematic documentation, record-keeping, and evidence-based improvement initiatives—along with self-evaluation and external accreditation efforts—the college achieved notable success in the statewide ranking conducted by the Department of Higher Education. The College secured 31<sup>st</sup> position among 141 Govt. Colleges across the state and an impressive 6th rank among 42 colleges with student strength of 500 to 1,000.

#### e) Adoption of Schools

Following directives from the Department of Higher Education, the college signed MoUs with nearby government schools to share academic resources and infrastructure. Faculty members provided career counseling, guidance on course selection, and awareness sessions on anti-drug abuse. Student feedback forms were collected to assess their perspectives on counseling initiatives.

#### f) Educational Tour

From December 3 to 7, 2024, the IQAC organized a five-day educational tour for the students. A group of 21 students accompanied by Dr. Vikas Suman and Ms. Anita Ranta visited Rishikesh, Agra, Mathura, Vrindavan, Haridwar, and Dehradun, including academic visits to the Indian Central Institute for Research on Goats (CIRG), Mathura, and the Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehradun.

#### (ii) CAREER COUNSELING & PLACEMENT CELL

The Career Counseling and Placement Cell (CCPC) plays a vital role in guiding students toward suitable career opportunities and equipping them with essential skills for the job market. It collaborates with various companies to understand their hiring needs and also supports students interested in entrepreneurship and freelancing.

#### KEY INITIATIVES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

a) On 29th November, 2024, a career counseling session was conducted by the CCP Cell,

featuring Mr. Dinesh Kumar, a resource person from Chandigarh Group of Colleges. He engaged students in an insightful discussion on the diverse career options available after graduation and post-graduation, along with prospects for career advancement.

- b) Rozgar Mela (February 22, 2025): The college organized a Rozgar Mela in collaboration with Skill Labs, Chandigarh, through an online platform. Students from various streams actively participated in the event, which aimed to raise awareness about the essential skills required, alongside academic qualifications, to secure rewarding career opportunities.
- c) Agniveer Recruitment Success: Two students from the college were selected under the *Agniveer Recruitment Scheme* of the Armed Forces, launched by the Government of India. They benefited from coaching provided by the CCP unit of the college.
- d) Selection in Himachal Pradesh Govt. Sector: Two students secured jobs in the Himachal Pradesh Police under the sports quota and five got job in HP Forest Department as Van Mitra, showcasing their dedication and athletic excellence.
- e) Academic Achievement: Mr. Sushil Kralta, an M.A. Political Science (3rd Semester) student, successfully cleared the UGC NET (Eligibility) exam, demonstrating academic excellence and commitment to higher education.

#### (iii) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Programme Officer: Prof. Sanjeev Justa

The National Service Scheme (NSS) was launched on 24th September 1969 with the objective to develop a sense of social responsibility, community service, and leadership among students. Currently, the college has one government-funded NSS unit with a sanctioned strength of 100 volunteers. The NSS unit successfully organized the following activities during the session 2024-25.

- (i) In August 2024, an enrollment drive to admit new volunteers was launched.
- (ii) Four one-day camps focused on campus beautification, cleanliness, and sanitation were organized during the session.
- (iii) On 24<sup>th</sup> September 2024, NSS Raising Day was celebrated under the national theme "Swachata Hi Seva". The event featured a variety of academic and cultural programs, along with a dedicated cleanliness drive across the college campus.
- (iv) On 4<sup>th</sup> November 2024, The Vyapar Mandal, Nerwa, organized a blood donation camp, where seven NSS volunteers, along with the NSS In-charge, Prof. Sanjeev Justa, participated enthusiastically with great zeal and fervour.
- (v) Four NSS volunteers participated in the Pre-Republic Day Selection Camp at Government College, Sanjauli on 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2024. Among them, Miss Mehak, of B.A. 2<sup>nd</sup> year, was selected for the Pre-RD Training Camp held at MLSM College Sunder Nagar on 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2024.

(vi) From 10<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> November 2024, a three-day Cleanliness Drive was organized at Churdhaar Temple. The initiative aimed to foster environmental consciousness and sensitivity towards cleanliness among the volunteers.

(iv) ROVERS AND RANGERS UNIT

Rovers Officer: Prof. Kalyan Singh

Rangers Officer: Prof. Aradhana Kumari

Rovers and Rangers form the senior wing of the Scouting and Guiding movement, fostering leadership, community service, and personal growth among college students. They actively raise awareness about crucial social issues such as poverty, illiteracy, and gender inequality.

In alignment with this vision, two Assistant Professors from our college, Prof. Aradhana Kumari and Prof. Kalyan Singh, accompanied twelve trainee students (eight Rangers and four Rovers) to the State-Level "Nipun Testing Camp" for Rovers and Rangers. The camp was organized by The Bharat Scouts and Guides, Himachal Pradesh at Rewalsar in Mandi district from Ocbtober 23 to 27, 2024 for rangers and from November 10 to 14, 2024 for rovers. This participation marked the formal establishment and operational commencement of the Rovers and Rangers Unit in our college. Currently, the unit boasts an enrollment of twenty-four students.
